

**A Century of Tallying Birds for the Annual Christmas Bird Count**

**Call of Life: Facing The Mass Extinction**

Documentary film (1-hour) at 2:00 pm investigates the threat to Earth's life support systems. Through interviews with leading biologists, ecologists, social scientists, indigenous leaders, and others, the film explores the causes, the scope, and the potential effects of the mass extinction. Paleontologist and Bruce Museum Paul Griswold Howes Fellow Kate Dzikiewicz will lead a discussion following the film. Related family activities all afternoon.
